Herber Middle School, 75 Ocean Avenue, Malverne, New York. Said Annual District Meeting and Election as set forth in the Notice of said Annual District Election, annexed hereto, shall be held for the purpose of electing one member of the Board of Education; voting upon the 2022-23 proposed school district budget to vote on an expenditure from the District Capital Reserve Fund for the construction of certain capital improvements to school facilities and to vote on any other matter which may regularly be proposed for voting therein accordance with law. The polls will remain open from 7:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. and as much longer as may be necessary to enable the voters then present to cast their ballots.</p> <p><u>Section II:</u> An Annual Public Budget Hearing for the purpose of discussion of the expenditure of funds and the budgeting thereof for school purposes for the 2022-2023 school year shall be held on Tuesday May 17, 2022, at 8:00 p.m. in the Malverne High School Library, Ocean Avenue, Malverne, New York.</p> <p><u>Section III:</u> The Public Notice of the Annual District Election and Budget Hearing provided for in Appendix A is deemed a part of this Resolution, including each and every proposition and election to be presented to the qualified registered voters of the School District required by law to be contained in such Notice, and is hereby approved.</p> <p><u>Section IV:</u> The District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice to be given of said Annual District Election and Budget Hearing in the form prescribed above, by publishing the Notice four times within the seven weeks next preceding such Annual District Election, the first publication to be at least forty-five days prior to the said Annual District Election, in</p>	<p>Approval of annual Election And Budget Vote and Public Notice</p>
